

## **Care & Cleaning**

- Before you lift or reposition your monitor, it is better to disconnect the
  cables and power cord. Follow the correct lifting techniques when
  positioning the monitor. When lifting or carrying the monitor, grasp the
  edges of the monitor. Do not lift the display by the stand or the cord.
- Cleaning. Turn your monitor off and unplug the power cord. Clean the monitor surface with a lint-free, non-abrasive cloth. Stubborn stains may be removed with a cloth dampened with mild cleaner.
- Avoid using a cleaner containing alcohol or acetone. Use a cleaner intended for use with the LCD. Never spray cleaner directly on the screen, as it may drip inside the monitor and cause an electric shock.

#### The following symptoms are normal with the monitor:

- The screen may flicker during the initial use due to the nature of the fluorescent light. Turn off the Power Switch and turn it on again to make sure that the flicker disappears.
- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- When the same image is displayed for hours, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image. The screen will recover slowly or you can turn off the Power Switch for hours.
- When the screen becomes black or flashes, or cannot work anymore, contact your dealer or service center to fix it. Do not repair the screen by yourself!



#### To assemble the monitor:




- While assembling the monitor arm/base, we recommend that you keep the monitor inside its EPS (Expanded Polystyrene) packaging.
- Align the screw hole on the arm with the bundled screw on the base.
   Then insert the base into the arm.
- 2. Fix the base to the arm by fastening the bundled screw.



#### 1.5.1 Using the Controls button

Use the control button on the bottom of the monitor to adjust the image settings.

#### 2. **b** Power Button:

Press this button to turn the monitor on/off.

#### 3 GameVisual:

 Press this hotkey to switch from eight video preset modes (Scenery Mode, Racing Mode, Cinema Mode, RTS/RPG Mode, FPS Mode, sRGB Mode, MOBA Mode and User Mode) with GameVisual™ Video Intelligence Technology.


#### 4. GamePlus Button:

GamePlus: The GamePlus Function provides a toolkit and creates a
better gaming environment for users when playing different types of
games. Particularly, Crosshair function is specially designed for new
gamers or beginners interested in First Person Shooter (FPS) games.

To active GamePlus:

Press GamePlus Button to enter the GamePlus main menu.


- Activate Crosshair, Timer or FPS Counter or Display Alignment function.
- Move the ♣ () button up/down to select and press ♣ () to confirm the function needed. Press ★ to go off, and exit.



- 5. X Close Button:
  - · Exit the OSD menu.
- 6. **♦** (5-way) Button:
  - Turns on the OSD menu. Enacts the selected OSD menu item.
  - Increases/Decreases values or moves your selection up/down/left/right

# 2.1 Adjusting the monitor

- For optimal viewing, we recommend that you look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.
- Hold the stand to prevent the monitor from falling when you change its angle.
- You can adjust the monitor's angle from +20° to -5° and it allows 62° swivel adjustment from either left or right. You can also adjust the monitor's height within 15cm.




# 2.2 Detaching the arm/stand (for VESA wall mount)

The detachable stand of this monitor is specially designed for VESA wall mount.

#### To detach the arm/stand

- Disconnect power and signal cables. Carefully put the monitor facedown on its EPS packaging.
- 2. Remove the screws covers.
- Remove the four (4) screws securing the arm to the rear of the monitor.
- 4. Detach the stand (arm and base) from the monitor.





- The VESA wall mount kit ( 100 x 100 mm) is purchased separately.
- Use only the UL Listed Wall Mount Bracket with minimum weight/load 28.8 kg (Screw size: M4 x 10 mm).
















# 3.1 OSD (On-Screen Display) menu

#### 3.1.1 How to reconfigure



- 1. Press Central of 5-way to activate the OSD menu.
- Press the ▼ and ▲ buttons to toggle between options in the Menu. As you move from one icon to another, the option name is highlighted.
- 3. To select the highlighted item on the menu press the Center key.
- 4. Press the ▼ and ▲ buttons to select the desired parameter.
- 6. Press the **◄/▶** to move left / right menu.

#### 3.1.2 OSD Function Introduction

#### 1. GameVisual

This function contains eight sub-functions that you can select for your preference. Each mode has the Reset selection, allowing you to maintain your setting or return to the preset mode.



- Scenery Mode: This is the best choice for scenery photo displaying with GameVisual™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- Racing Mode: This is the best choice for racing game playing with GameVisual™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- Cinema Mode: This is the best choice for movie watching with GameVisual™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- RTS/RPG Mode: This is the best choice for Real-Time Strategy(RTS)/ Role-Playing Game(RPG) playing with GameVisual™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- FPS Mode: This is the best choice for First Person Shooter game playing with GameVisual™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- sRGB Mode: This is the best choice for viewing photos and graphics from PCs.
- MOBA Mode: This is the best choice for Multiplayer Online Battle Arena (MOBA) games playing with GameVisual™ Video intelligence Technology.
- User Mode: More items are adjustable in the Color menu.



- In the Racing Mode, the Saturation, Sharpness, and ASCR functions are not user-configurable.
- In the sRGB, the Saturation, Skin Tone, Color Temp., Sharpness, Brightness, Contrast and ASCR functions are not user-configurable.
- In the MOBA Mode, the Saturation, Sharpness and ASCR functions are not user-configurable.

#### 2. Blue Light Filter

Adjust the energy level of blue light emitted from LED backlight.



- Level 0: No change.
- Level 1~4: The higher the level, the more blue light will be reduced.



- When Blue Light Filter is activated, the default settings of Racing Mode will be automatically imported.
- Between Level 1 to Level 3, the Brightness function is user-configurable.
- Level 4 is optimized setting. It is compliance with TUV Low Blue Light Certification. The Brightness function is not user-configurable.



Please refer to the following to alleviate eve strains:

- Users should take some time away from the display if working for long hours.
   It is advised to take short breaks (at least 5 mins) after around 1 hour of
   continuous working at the computer. Taking short and frequent breaks is more
   effective than a single longer break.
- To minimize eye strain and dryness in your eyes, users should rest the eye
  periodically by focusing on objects that are far away.
- Eye exercises can help to reduces eye strain. Repeat these exercises often. If
  eye strain continues please consult a physician. Eye exercises: (1) Repeating
  look up and down (2) Slowly roll your eyes (3) Move your eyes diagonal.
- High energy blue light may lead to eye strain and AMD (Age-Related Macular Degeneration). Blue light Filter to reduce 70% (max.) harmful blue light to avoiding CVS (Computer Vision Syndrome).

#### 3. Color

Select the image color you like from this function.



- Brightness: The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Contrast: The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Saturation**: The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Color Temp.: Contains three preset color modes (Cool, Normal, Warm) and User Mode.
- Skin Tone: Contains three color modes including Reddish, Natural, and Yellowish.



 In the User Mode, colors of R (Red), G (Green), and B (Blue) are userconfigurable; the adjusting range is from 0 ~ 100.

#### 4. Image

You can adjust the image Sharpness, Trace Free, VividPixel, Adaptive-Sync/FreeSync, HDR, Shadow Boost, Aspect Control, ASCR from this main function.




- Sharpness: Adjusts the picture sharpness. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Trace Free: Speeds up the response time by Over Drive technology. The adjusting range is from lower 0 to faster 100.
- VividPixel: ASUS Exclusive Technology that brings lifelike visuals for crystal-clear and detail-oriented enjoyment. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Adaptive-Sync/FreeSync: It can allow a Adaptive-Sync/FreeSync supported graphics source to dynamically adjust display refresh rate based on typical content frame rates for power efficient, virtually stutter free and low-latency display update.
- HDR:High Dynamic Range. Contains two HDR modes (ASUS Cinema HDR and ASUS Gaming HDR).
- Shadow Boost:Dark color enhancement adjust monitor gamma curve to enrich the dark tones in an image making dark scenes and objects much easier be found.
- Aspect Control: Adjusts the aspect ratio to "Full". "4:3".
- ASCR: Select ON or OFF to enable or disable dynamic contrast ratio function.ASCR is Disabled when ELMB is on.



 Choose 4:3 to display the picture according to the original aspect ratio of the input source.


#### 5. Input Select


Select the input source from **HDMI-1**, **HDMI-2** or **DisplayPort** input signal.



#### 6. System Setup

Adjusts the system configuration.





- GameVisual Demo Mode: Activate the demo mode for the GameVisual function.
- Volume: Adjusts the output volume level.

- **ECO Mode**: Activate the ecology mode for power saving.
- OSD Setup: Adjusts the OSD Timeout, DDC/CI, and Transparency of the OSD screen.
- Language: Select OSD language. The selections are: English, French, German, Spanish, Italian, Dutch, Russian, Poland, Czech, Croatia, Hungary, Romania, Portugal, Turkey, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, Japanese. Korean, Persian, Thai and Indonesian.
- Key Lock: Disable all key functions. Pressing the down button for more than five seconds to disable key lock function.
- **Information**: Displays the monitor information.
- More: Return the next page of System Setting.
- Back: Return the previous page of System Setting.
- Power Indicator: Turn the power LED indicator on/off.
- Power Key Lock: To disable / enable power key.
- All Reset: Selects "Yes" to revert all settings to the factory default mode.

#### 7. MyFavorite

Load/Save all settings on the monitor.

# 3.3 Troubleshooting (FAQ)

Problem	Possible Solution
Power LED is not ON	<ul> <li>Press the O button to check if the monitor is in the ON mode.</li> <li>Check if the power cord is properly connected to the monitor and the power outlet.</li> <li>Check Power Indicator function in main menu OSD. Select "ON" to turn on power LED.</li> </ul>
The power LED lights amber and there is no screen image	<ul> <li>Check if the monitor and the computer are in the ON mode.</li> <li>Make sure the signal cable is properly connected the monitor and the computer.</li> <li>Inspect the signal cable and make sure none of the pins are bent.</li> <li>Connect the computer with another available monitor to check if the computer is properly working.</li> </ul>
Screen image is too light or dark	Adjust the Contrast and Brightness settings via OSD.
Screen image bounces or a wave pattern is present in the image	<ul> <li>Make sure the signal cable is properly connected to the monitor and the computer.</li> <li>Move electrical devices that may cause electrical interference.</li> </ul>
Screen image has color defects (white does not look white)	<ul> <li>Inspect the signal cable and make sure that none of the pins are bent.</li> <li>Perform Reset via OSD.</li> <li>Adjust the R/G/B color settings or select the Color Temperature via OSD.</li> </ul>
No sound or sound is low	<ul> <li>Adjust the volume settings of both your monitor and computer.</li> <li>Make sure the computer sound card driver is properly installed and activated.</li> </ul>
